JUSTICE, EQUITY, DIVERSITY, AND INCLUSION (JEDI) TODAY

Today's landscape around JEDI is evolving at a rapid pace. Increasing numbers of educators, students, and families are expecting schools to display a commitment to a safe and caring learning environment for all students. Moreover, it's clear that we must move beyond merely accommodating the needs of marginalized students, families and educators. School community members of all identities, perspectives, and experiences should feel physically and emotionally safe, welcomed and affirmed at school. Together, we need to move towards fostering an environment where everyone can thrive; an environment that respects, celebrates, and welcomes diversity.

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PRIMARY WORKSHOPS

2SLGBTQ+ INCLUSIVITY WORKSHOP

This workshop is the perfect starting point (or refresher) for educators looking to foster more inclusive and affirming schools for 2SLGBTQ+ students. Combining foundational terms and concepts, storytelling, reflection activities, best allyship practices, and space to ask questions and work through scenarios, this workshop provides participants with the knowledge and practical tools they need to build and support environments that respect, welcome, and celebrate all.

FOLLOW-UP WORKSHOPS



2SLGBTQ+ HISTORY WORKSHOP

Participants will consider, "Why does 2SLGBTQ+ history matter?" as they learn how the vast 2SLGBTQ+ past is connected to the present and future.The workshop briefly explores gender and sexual diversity around the world throughout time before focusing on North American 2SLGBTQ+ history and the evolution of queer representation. Starting in the 1960s and moving through the decades, we discuss notable people, events, and milestones including some of the raids, riots, legal changes and shifts in pop culture and music that influenced 2SLGBTQ+ society today.

This workshop is currently only being offered virtually.

- A better understanding of the power of pop culture and social media to generate social change and a discussion on reparations, acknowledgments and changes born from the advocacy of Black voices
- A greater awareness of how this history shapes our present, especially the systemic oppression in education, and how the fight for justice is far from over
- Increased motivation and capacity to celebrate Black excellence 365 days a year

TRANS 101 WORKSHOP

Designed as a follow up to our 2SLGBTQ+ Inclusivity workshop, this engaging session led by two veteran trans speakers is for educators interested in fostering inclusive environments where all members of the community feel safe and comfortable to explore and express their gender identity and gender expression. Compassionate speakers will create a brave space for participants to learn terminology, explore the harmful impacts of gender stereotypes, unlearn transphobic myths and stereotypes, ask honest questions and work through realistic scenarios.


